



Joseph Barton and his cousin Lewis Martin left for the California gold fields in August 1852. The trip is documented in a series of six letters that Joseph sent home and which his son Everett Barton saved and transcribed.

\*\*August 30, 1852 Philadelphia, Pa. Saw ships at wharf

\*\*August 31, 1852 Philadelphia, Pa. Walnut St. Theater on Tuesday evening.

\*\*September 1, 1852 Philadelphia, Pa. Left for New York at 8 am.

September 5, 1852 New York Letter to Mother (Catherine Umberger Barton). Info preceded with \*\* is information from this letter.

\*\*September 6, 1852 New York Board the ship Great Ohio at 2 o'clock.

\*September 20, 1852 Left Panama

\*September 27, 1852 Arrived Acapulco

\*October 6, 1852 Arrived in San Francisco

October 7, 1852 San Francisco Letter home.
